2. SENIORS have priority. They must be on track for graduation and ***must not be more than 5 credits deficient***. Juniors will be accepted if space is available but must meet the same requirements as the seniors.
3. 2.0 GPA
4. **EXCELLENT ATTENDANCE** (No more than 5 absences in spring semester- ***Very Important***)
After 3rd absence, student will be dropped from the program!

CREDIT: Students completing course will receive 5 credits of Justice/Pre Law/ Field Study.
