Applicants must meet all of the following criteria:

- be a high school senior with a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale or the equivalent.
- live in [Southern California Edison's \(SCE\) service territory](#).
- plan to attend a full-time undergraduate course of study at an accredited four-year college or university in the U.S. for the 2022/2023 academic year.
- plan to enroll in an [eligible major](#) in computer and information services, engineering, engineering technology, management information systems, mathematics, natural resources and conservation, or physical sciences.
- demonstrate financial need.
- Dependents of Edison International and SCE employees or retirees are not eligible for the Edison Scholars Program.

Who should apply?

- Applicants must have been born on or after Oct. 15, 2001.
- Applicants must be entering college for the first time during the fall of 2022-2023 school year. This means that the application is for students who will be high school seniors in the fall of 2021; for those who are in GED programs; and for those who plan to take a gap year. Students who have college credit through high school programs are eligible.
- Applicants must have experienced homelessness within the last six years.
- Applicants must reside in the United States.
- Undocumented students who meet these criteria are eligible.

While scholarship opportunities for undocumented students seem scarce, there are opportunities, nonetheless. Not all scholarships will explicitly call for "undocumented" students - they may require students to have a specific status such as DACA, AB 540, etc. Some scholarships may not even ask about immigration status or citizenship, so you may qualify for those scholarships if you are currently undocumented. Make sure to check your state's immigration laws and policies when applying for scholarships and other forms of financial aid.
